### Driver's Education -Virtual Option Available

Central Lakes Driving School is offering a virtual Driver's Education class. Each class we host will be online via Zoom and our web-based learning software. Students need to be present on Zoom all 10 days of the class. This is a State approved course for any student in MN.

This is not a Minnewaska community education class.

Classroom only cost: \$160

Behind-the-wheel only cost: \$450

This is for students under 18 who took their drivers ed classroom with a different driving school. Behind the wheel sessions are 2 hours long and depart from the Alexandria office.

Combination package deal cost: \$498

This includes the 30 hours of classroom and 6 hours of behind-the-wheel requirement for anyone under age 18 in Minnesota.

There are no in-person classes offered at this time.

Note: Students must be 15 to take the state knowledge test to obtain an instruction permit. Permit must be held a minimum of 6 months, or until the student is 16, to take a state road test to obtain a license. Students must have 50 hours in a driving log with a licensed driver 21+. They also must complete 3 BTW sessions (2 hours each) with a licensed instructor. This is included with the package offered through Central Lakes Driving School.





# **EARLY CHILDHOOD FAMILY EDUCATION**

Early Childhood Family Education classes (ECFE) offers classes for all families and their children ages birth through 5 (not yet in Kindergarten). ECFE classes are a fun way for you and your child to learn and grow together while exploring new experiences and meeting other families. The program engages adults and their children in educational activities and experiences that foster children's social, emotional, cognitive, physical and language skills.

#### What to Expect:

<u>Separating classes:</u> For one half of the class, families and children are together exploring and learning in the early childhood classroom. During the second half of the class, adults will separate for discussion and learning about child development and parenting topics. During this time, the children will explore the classroom with the early childhood teachers.

Non-Separating classes: Families and children will stay together for the entire time exploring and learning in the classroom with an early childhood teacher.


